

Additional Notes	Multiple individuals per member household were allowed to participate, but one completed survey per member household was randomly selected for analysis.

The vast majority of members rate Rancho Santa Fe as either an excellent or good community.






More than half of members say they moved to RSF because it is a quiet, private and rural community, with a sizeable percentage attracted to its large lots.


No single issue dominates as members' top priority for the Association.


The most important services to residents are wildfire prevention, financial management and the RSF Patrol.


Members are satisfied with many services/features, with the RSF Patrol and the trail network leading the way.



- P. Efforts to prevent and mitigate the threat of wildfires in the community



TENNIS CLUB MEMBERS: Comparison of Tennis Club Importance of and Satisfaction with Services/Features




Community Attributes

Trails are overwhelmingly considered to be in at least good shape; few properties/facilities are considered to be in poor condition by substantial numbers of members.






Q10. The following are some properties and facilities within the Rancho Santa Fe community. Please rank the physical condition of that area: excellent, good, just average, poor, or very poor.

(Ranked by Excellent/Good)






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
Community Events

Would you like more events, programming or additional activities for all members at Osuna Ranch, the Arroyo Preserve or other open spaces?








There is more support than opposition for nearly all of the proposed new community features.

Conclusions

Conclusions

- Rancho Santa Fe members generally rate the community as either "excellent" or "good," with very few who would describe it as "poor."
- Similarly, three-quarters of members are satisfied with the job being done by the Association.
- Repairing roads and development of more shopping/ markets in the Village are high priorities for the Association's focus.



Conclusions; Continued

- The most important services to residents are wildfire prevention, financial management and the RSF Patrol.
- Members are satisfied with many services/features, with the RSF Patrol and the trail network leading the way.
- There is a general trend of services/features that are more important also being the ones with the higher satisfaction levels
 - The Patrol is one of the higher priorities and also has the highest satisfaction level.
 - Wildfire prevention, the health of trees and the forest, and member communication are considered to be more important, but have satisfaction at or below the median level.
 - Protection of traditional RSF architecture and the dark skies requirements are lower priorities and also the areas with the least satisfaction.



Conclusions; Continued

 For golf members, the golf course and pro shop are rated highly, while the clubhouse and locker room receive softer ratings.

 Among tennis members, the courts and club experience are rated highly, while the ratings of the pro shop and pickleball courts are more mixed.



Conclusions; Continued

- Members have mixed attitudes on the need to uphold historic architectural standards. About six-in-ten think the Art Jury should stringently uphold those standards, but only two-in-ten "definitely" think so. At the same time, a nearly equal number think the Art Jury process should be more flexible in considering designs requested by members.
- There are not significant concerns about the condition of the properties and facilities within RSF except for the Tennis Clubhouse and County roads.
- About four-in-ten are interested in more events at Osuna Ranch, Arroyo Preserve or other open spaces, compared to about a quarter who are not.



Conclusions, Continued

- There is majority support for and limited opposition to the development of a children's playground and spaces for community gatherings/private events.
- Majorities also support development of a dog park and fitness center, but more than two-in-ten oppose them.
- There is more opposition than support for a community swimming pool.
